





Objectives of the Camden Transport Strategy (CTS)

- To transform our streets and places to enable an increase in walking and cycling
- To reduce and mitigate the impact of transport-based emissions and noise in Camden

- To reduce car ownership and use, and motor traffic levels in Camden
- To deliver an efficient, well-maintained highways network and kerbside space that prioritises the sustainable movement of goods and people
- To deliver a sustainable transport system and streets that are accessible and inclusive for all
- To ensure economic growth and regeneration is supported by, and supports, a sustainable transport network
- To substantially reduce all road traffic casualties in Camden and progress towards zero Killed and Seriously Injured casualties



Camden Climate Action Plan: Transport Actions

We have made some good progress with the transport or place-related actions in the Climate Action Plan 2020-25

	Progress (increase from 2019 to 2024)
continue to regularly review and amend parking permits and prices to reliect the climate emergency, and roll out electric vehicle (EV) charging points across Camden in line with our EV Action Plan	Highly ambitious parking fees and charges near completion +416 EVCPs (from 142 to 558)
Increase the number of segregated cycle routes in Camden as identified in the Camden Transport Strategy.	+18 km (from 8 to 26 km)
From 2020, trial the closure of Camden High Street to traffic around the market with a view to a permanent closure.	Consultation on pedestrianisation trial launched in Summer 2024
In 2020, successfully deliver the Camley Street Sustainable Urban Drainage System (SuDS) project and continue to identify funding opportunities to improve Camden's climate change resilience.	Done (plus many more SUDS implemented)

Camden Climate Action Plan: Transport Actions

Action	Progress (increase from 2019 to 2024)
Progress a Workplace Parking Levy by 2023 to encourage low carbon transport choices, subject to the outcome of the current feasibility study.	Ongoing feasibility study
Review and amend Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) hours of control to restrict non-essential motor vehicle trips with priority CPZ areas reviewed by 2023.	Extended hours of control (on a trial basis/ permanently) in CA-G, CA-Z, CA-X, CA-L, CA-F. Further reviews planned in other CPZs from 2025 onwards
Camden Town, Kentish Town and Frognal by 2023.	Holborn: several quick win schemes delivered or under consultation Camden Town: ongoing consultation for pedestrianisation trial
Increase the number of street closures around schools through the Healthy School Streets programme.	+31 (from 4 to 35)
☐ From 2023, establish a permanent parklet programme to support the roll out of parklets	A sponsor-led parklet programme to be re-opened in 2025. Guidelines developed for designing, installing, and maintaining parklets







Healthy Streets Score Card 2024: Camden





We score high year after year.

We also deliver beyond our expected score when adjusted for density.

Geographical priorities are informed by diverse datasets

PTAL (Public Transport Accessibility Level):

an indicator of how well-served an area is by public transport

Walking and cycling potential:

to consider the potential for growth in walking and cycling

Car ownership:

to focus our schemes on pockets with high car ownership and usage

Road casualties:


to target areas that are seeing high number of road collisions and casualties

Air quality data:

to prioritise neighbourhoods that suffer from comparatively poor air quality

Demographics and deprivation:

to ensure our interventions are reaching everyone, especially our most vulnerable residents



Four Themes of the Climate Action Plan

Theme 1 - PEOPLE

Everyone in Camden will be well informed and actively contribute to tackling the climate crisis in all aspects of their lives.

Theme 2 - PLACES

Our public spaces will **encourage** and **enable healthy and sustainable travel choices** and **promote biodiversity**.

Theme 3 - BUILDINGS

Our buildings will be energy efficient, comfortable and fit-for-purpose for a zero-carbon future.

Theme 4 - ORGANISATIONS

All organisations in Camden will operate responsibly and embed tackling the climate crisis throughout their operations.

What you've said about transport in the past

- More shared car services available and affordable
- Remove more parking spaces
- EV chargers need their parking spaces protected or they will be blocked and useless
- Better lighting for pedestrian paths. Encourage safe walking
- Pedestrianised roads, no petrol vehicles, less cars, more public transport
- Enforce/prevent anti-social illegal parking. May be plant trees to stop pavement parking
- Stop front gardens being used for parking
- Disparity of healthy school street roll-out
- WTS more pedestrian crossings
- Wider pavements, so it's safer to walk
- More street cleaning
